PLAN FOR WATER WORKSHOP - STAGES 7-11: GLOBAL CLIMATE PROJECTIONS AND UNIMPAIRED HYDROLOGY

Jennifer Hanson, General Manager, provided a brief update, commented on page numbering, and introduced Jared Emery with Western Hydrologics Consulting, who presented the item, which included:

- Projected hydrology
- Projected demands
- Scenario overview

- Selection of bookend scenarios
- Strategic alternatives
- Next steps

- Future discussion regarding an extended irrigation season analysis to better understand the scope

Public Comment:

- Aaron Zettler-Mann, South Yuba River Citizens League, commented on the following:
 - Hydrology collected for spring, summer, and fall, but have not had time to QA/QC that data, and hope to look at data this winter for Van Norden
 - In support of Scenarios 1, 5, and 8 for strategic alternatives
- Trevor Caulder, participating as a member of the public, commented on the following:
 - Commented on scenarios where knowing the probability would be helpful
 - Inquired how often a dry 3-year scenario will occur
 - Commented against random selection of three scenarios and in support of agreeing on increased storage goal based on current data
 - Initially in support of scenarios 1, 5, and 6, and ultimately communicated support for scenarios 1, 5, and 9
- Chris Shutes, California Sportfishing Alliance, commented on the following:
 - Spoke in support of Scenario 8 to see the benefits of low demand without an offsetting wet climate pattern
- Gus Tolley, member of the public, commented on the following:
 - Suggested using wider bookends, stating that the widest range for planning scenarios are 1, 5, and 9 and that realistic scenarios are 1, 5, and 6
 - \circ Considering future legislation, he recommends scenarios 1, 5, and 9
- Otis Wollan, resident of Colfax, commented on the following:
 - Commented on conservation when in drought and voluntary reductions
- Dianna Suarez, resident of Colfax, commented on the following:
 - Spoke in favor of scenarios 3,5 and 7
