MINUTES

January 25, 2024

The Board of Directors of the Nevada Irrigation District convened in special session at the District's main office located at 1036 W. Main Street, Grass Valley, on the 25th day of January 2024, at 3 p.m.

A presentation was provided, and a discussion ensued for input on alternatives for addressing future predicted unmet demands.

 - Requested review of what demand is being used in the IDC Model and more information on projected unmet demand
 - Ag crop demands
 - Determining high demand and alternative ways of thinking about what contributes to demand
 - o Considering sediment in preliminary thoughts of raising Rollins Reservoir
 - Commented on storing water for drought contingency planning, conservation of water, and preparing for worst-case
 - o Commented on oversizing for delivery benefits and promoting growth
 - o Including Hydro operations on the original application
 - o Identifying an environmentally preferred alternative
 - Spoke in support of water conservation program
 - o Enjoyed participating in today's meeting
 - PFW Process / Plan when will BOD be presented with options, and who is preparing, planning, and providing planning docs and technical memorandum
 - Requested a list of PFW docs being prepared with author and status
 - Provided a document to the Board and General Manager regarding CA Professional Engineering Standards and read an excerpt
- Joy Waite, member of the public
 - Spoke about the ecosystem
 - Consumptive demand
 - o Rise Gold
 - Participation at the Localizing California Waters Conference in November
 - Impacts on landowners around Rollins Lake

- Impacts to PCWA and water they get from PG&E
- o Commented on sediment at Rollins Lake and Steep Hollow Creek
- o Potential issues if Hydro is not included on the original application
- Laura Peters, member of the public and former NID Board Member:
 - o Posting the preliminary cost estimate that the reported estimate is based on
 - o Offer of water to Southern California in the AWWA pitch for Prop 1 Grants
 - o Clarification regarding delivery water/contract water
 - Pertaining to the actual water demand input into the new demand model, inquired if the number of miners inches of acre-feet of water were contracted for annually
 - o Suggested the District work with ag users to help build ponds or get tanks
 - o Topping storage up in early October for use through winter
 - Requested technical documents published as prepared for all to be informed going into meetings
- Gary Zimmerman, member of the public:
 - o Cost and including an estimate for additional cost of financing
 - Financial feasibility
 - o Suggested speaking with bonding agencies
- Jeff Litton, member of the public:
 - o Utilizing modern technology in modeling to determine property use
 - o Concern about inflating demand
 - Rollins sediment estimated in 2015, current estimate, and if considered coupling dam raising with sediment removal
 - If the state is to be petitioned for a Rollins raise, inquired if it would it be for an amount nearly double the raise
 - o Thanked the Board for looking at alternatives
 - Suggested District would have many more supporters for the proposal of raising Rollins, as it appears it would back up Bear River about a mile or less
